## **Youth Transitional Intervention Program (YTIP)**

**With ACRA/ACC services Targeting REENTRY YOUTH and their families**

The Youth Transitional Intervention Program (YTIP) services with A-CRA/ACC services serves substance abusing *Latino* juvenile offenders, both male and female, between the ages of 14-18 ½ years old, in Orange County, California who are currently incarcerated in a County juvenile detention facility and/or are under supervision by Probation. YTIP provides youth offenders with access to immediate substance abuse treatment upon release. This *intensive aftercare program* provide Latino reentry youth and their families with culturally relevant and language appropriate aftercare services that will extend substance abuse treatment, prevent recidivism, improve youth environments (family, school, work, and community), and provide access to pro-social activities and local resources.

### **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:**

Youth between the ages of 14-18 ½ years old prior to being released & Youth is **currently** in custody at an Orange County facility (i.e. YGC, YLA, Juvenile Hall, Youth Resource Centers, etc.) or under supervision with Probation( ie. house arrest, day reporting, etc).

### **FREE SERVICES**

### **THIS PROGRAM WILL PROVIDE:**

- Youth will be administered the Global Appraisal of Individual Needs (GAIN) questionnaire during the initial meeting to assist in the development of their treatment plan.
- 4-6 weeks of Transition Planning Sessions with youth while in custody at a youth detention facility to establish rapport and assess the needs of youth and the family prior to release.
- 12-15 therapy sessions using the Adolescent Community Reinforcement Approach (A-CRA) with youth. These sessions include the functional analyses of substance use and pro-social behaviors, encouragement of pro-social behaviors, and other relapse prevention skill training procedures. Services can also be delivered through home and community visits.
- 4-6 sessions of Brief Strategic Family Therapy, a problem-focused, and practical approach to the elimination/reduction of substance abuse risk factors and problematic behaviors in youth through parental involvement.
- 12 or more sessions of the Assertive Continuing Care (ACC) model which incorporates case management services including barrier reduction, advocacy, crisis management, linkage to other support services, and ongoing assessment of needs.
- Monthly peer groups
